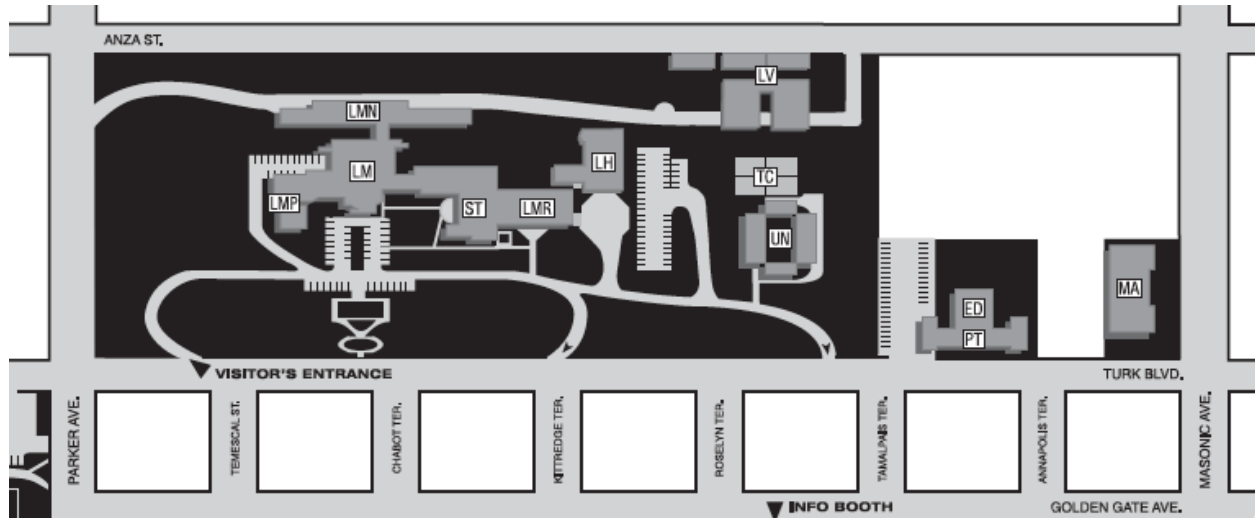

Arriving by car
