Keynote Speaker

4:00 – 5:00 Dr. Franklin Odo, “Voices from the Canefields: Folksongs from Japanese Immigrant Workers in Hawai’i”

Franklin Odo was Founding Director of the Asian Pacific American Center at the Smithsonian Institution (1997-2010) and Interim Chief of the Asian Division, Library of Congress (2011).

Odo was among the few faculty members when Asian American Studies was established at UCLA. He was professor of Ethnic Studies at the University of Hawai’i and visiting professor of History and/or American Studies at the University of Pennsylvania, Hunter College, Princeton, and Columbia Universities in the 1990s.

Odo’s publications include *No Sword to Bury: Japanese Americans in Hawai’i during World War II* (2004, Temple University Press) and *Voices from the Canefields: Folksongs from Japanese Immigrant Workers in Hawai’i* (2013, Oxford University Press). He has a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Association for Asian American Studies and a Distinguished Service Award from the Asian American Justice Center. In April 2013, Odo was appointed Humanist in Residence at the John Nicholas Brown Center for Public Humanities at Brown University. He currently leads a “Theme Study on Asian American Pacific Islanders” for the National Historic Landmarks Project of the National Park System.

GETTING TO CAMPUS AND THE LIBRARY EVENTS ROOM

By Car:

From the North: Take Highway 101 South, cross the Golden Gate Bridge. Take 19th Avenue/Highway 1 exit. Follow 19th Avenue to campus at Holloway Avenue.

To get to the parking garage, turn right onto Holloway Ave and continue to Font Blvd. Turn right onto Font Blvd. and continue to Lake Merced Blvd. Turn right onto Lake Merced Blvd. then take an immediate right onto State Drive which is the entrance to the parking garage.

From the South: Take I-280 North, exit at 19th Avenue. Take Junipero Serra Boulevard to Holloway Avenue, turn left on Holloway Avenue to campus at 19th Avenue.

To get to the parking garage, continue on Holloway Ave to Font Blvd. Turn right onto Font Blvd. and continue to Lake Merced Blvd. Turn right onto Lake Merced Blvd. then take an immediate right onto State Drive which is the entrance to the parking garage.

From the East: Take I-80 West across the Bay Bridge to Highway 101 South. Take 101 South to I-280 toward Daly City. Take the San Jose Avenue/Mission St. exit (immediately after the Ocean Avenue exit), bearing right onto Sagamore Street to Brotherhood Way to Junipero Serra Boulevard North. Take Junipero Serra Boulevard to Holloway Avenue, turn left on Holloway Avenue to campus at 19th Avenue.

To get directly to the parking garage stay on Brotherhood Way and turn right onto Lake Merced Blvd. Turn right onto State Drive which is the third light after turning onto Lake Merced Blvd. and immediately after Font Blvd.

By BART:

Take any San Francisco-bound BART train to the Daly City BART station. There is no free shuttle service on weekends but MUNI and SamTrans have bus service from the Daly City BART station. MUNI's 28 line and SamTrans' 3B line serve the campus 7 days a week.

Using your Clipper Card you can ride MUNI for free (roundtrip) within a 23 hour period. If you are being charged for MUNI 28, to get to campus, then go to the Clipper card website and request a refund. The website is clippercard.com

By MUNI:

From downtown San Francisco, take MUNI Metro M-Oceanview streetcar.

The campus is also served by the following MUNI bus lines:

M- Oceanview- streetcar to downtown and Balboa Park Station.

17- Park Merced to West Portal Station.

18- 46th Avenue/Zoo, Sunset and Richmond Districts, Palace of the Legion of Honor.

28- 19th Avenue to Daly City BART station, Sunset and Richmond Districts, Golden Gate Bridge, Fort Mason. (28L- limited service Monday-Friday only).

29- Sunset to Ingleside, Excelsior, Bayview districts and Candlestick Park.
